



Treasurers Report

All members – GFCSA

Financial Overview of Club



Club revenues have increased slightly on last year for the same period. Members come and go but overall, the numbers stay consistent so revenues from membership fees are stable. Despite difficult times, Advertising and Sponsorship revenues increased, accounting for most of the increase in the comparison.

Expenses were on par with last year's result, with lower rents but additional outgoings. Function and tournament expenses were a little lower.

Receivables were at \$6k at the end of October with the recent addition of Advertising invoices (shirt sleeve sponsors) but have reduced since then.

Other than day to day running costs, the Club has no financial liabilities.

Year to date receipts totalled more than \$45k compared to \$43k last year. Total expenses at the end of October are \$14k compared to \$14k last year. Interest receipts lifted the current surplus to \$33k compared to \$27k last year. The Club had almost \$190k in cash assets out of a total of \$329k all assets.

Our North Island Adventure

After spending all that time on the boat crossing the ditch we decided we would hire a camper and explore the north island. As we drove off in our camper it didn't take long before we started to appreciate the beauty of New Zealand. From huge rugged mountains, rain forests and lush green mountains that lead to beautiful sandy beaches.

One of our first experiences was a farmer moving his cows down the road. We pulled over as per his instructions and shortly after our car was surrounded by cows. We had to wind up our windows as some of them where getting too friendly and sticking their heads in the window.





Our first stop was Cape Reinga light house. This is where the Tasman and Pacific Ocean meet. We had only experienced this treacherous stretch of water a few days ago, seeing it from land was a much more pleasurable experience.

A few days had passed and I thought I'd better try my hand at fly fishing. Having never fly fished before I got some tips from the local fishing store, purchased all my gear and was ready to catch some trout. It only took 30 minutes before I had my first fish on the hook, I carefully played the fish and soon after I landed my first rainbow trout. I absolutely loved it! I was so excited I took a quick photo, released the fish and went straight back to fishing. I had completely forgotten that our plan was to eat one for dinner. Luckily I landed another 4 after that so it was back to the camper to cook our freshly caught rainbow trout. I was ecstatic with my first attempt at fly fishing.



Dec 2018

One of our favourite experiences in the north was black water rafting, this is where we would be floating underground on a tube, climbing up waterfalls as well as jumping off them into the pools below. It was truly an amazing experience, floating in complete darkness looking at glow worms underground. We have experienced so many more amazing things however what made New Zealand so special was the people we would meet. We would just say hello, have a quick chat and they would give so much. We got invited out on a complete strangers boats for fishing, got given freshly caught fish, oysters, and much more.



After 5 weeks and 5000km driving around the north island it was time to get back on the boat, so we headed back to The Bay of Islands. The Bay of islands is one place every boaty should see, with its 144 subtropical islands it is famous for its stunning beauty, history, as well as the fishing.



We left Opua marina and had only been driving for 15 minutes when I saw a huge flock of birds working. I immediately threw the rods out, and within minutes we had a quadruple hook up, with only 2 of us on board things got a little chaotic . I was hoping for a kingfish but unfortunately we only pulled up some huge kahawi (Salmon). We pulled out the 3kg outfit and were having fun catching and releasing the salmon. I spotted a king fish chasing my salmon, I quickly rigged up a live bait and within minutes I was on. After a short battle I landed my first New Zealand 14kg kingfish.



We spent 6 weeks out on the boat exploring the east cost from north cape to Auckland. New Zealand is truly a boating / fisherman paradise. It has so many islands, incredible stunning anchorages and many marinas for fuel and supplies. There are so many caves and crevasse that you can drive your boat and tender into and watch the huge snapper and kingfish come up to the boat for a feed.



As we would arrive to a new marina our first stop was the local game fishing club. At every marina there is a club, these clubs are massive and always be filled with people. We would sign in the members book grab a beer and get straight into some fishing talk with the locals, finding out all the local knowledge. It surely helped on one particular trip, we landed 14 kingfish over 2 days, the biggest weighing in at 21 kg. We also landed snapper, sharks, Tarakihi as well as a varieties of other fish.


Dec 2018

The 2 islands we spent most of our time at was Great Barrier Island and Waiheke Island. Waiheke Island is only 15nm from Auckland and has great beaches, some of New Zealand's best boutique wineries, a number of art galleries, scenic walking trails, and acres of olive groves. We enjoyed driving the boat from one anchorage to the next and tendering to shore to sample the local wines.

Great Barrier Island is 50nm from Auckland and is a place of unspoiled beaches and vast tracts of native forest. Great Barrier Island's rugged, untouched beautiful coastlines, bays, lakes and rivers make her a boating paradise. We spent over 10 days here and had winds of up to 40 knots at times. We never had trouble finding a safe anchorage as it is surrounded by many more smaller islands. We made some great friends here, so much so that we began drinking with the locals. 4pm every day we would join the locals for a few beers and plenty of yarns. They were extremely friendly in sharing there local fishing spots, local produce as well as cooking food for us. The strange part about this was we would be drinking outside the public library, the pub is only open Friday and Saturday, so every other day the library became the local water hole.



There is an anchorage called Smokehouse Bay that is only accessible by boat. 


All the kids had received a Present from Father X-Mass and by around 7-30pm everyone had gone home.





A perfect Port Lincoln day in early October with light winds and a few mates over from Adelaide, we decided to head off in calm seas to the local whiting grounds down the Thorny Passage. My mates were not experienced fishermen but were looking forward to the challenge of getting a good feed of King George whiting.

We dropped into one of my favourite whiting haunts in 8m of water and had a good haul of 35-38cm whiting when my 200 Calcutta went off on a screaming run. With line peeling off the reel in a straight line towards the shore my initial thoughts were an Eagle Ray, however when the run stopped and head shakes were felt, my thoughts turned to a Gummy Shark as the area we were fishing is not known for Snapper. The fight went on for 15 mins as I was on 10 lb line and I was being extremely careful as I was using light whiting trace and size 6 hooks. I was determined not to lose the fish and was instructing my novice crew on what to do when the fish was nearer the boat.

Colour soon appeared and slowly the fish came to the surface and I realised we had a large snapper at the boat. My crew did a terrific job and we soon had the fish safely on board.

The fish was luckily hooked in the soft part of the lip. On trying to remove the long shank size 6 hook the hook broke in half, so I was very lucky.

After lots of photos and congratulations all round, we weighed the fish and it came in at 12 kgs.

In all we had a great days fishing with our bag limit of good sized King George Whiting and my best Snapper from the Port Lincoln area.







National recreational fishing survey of Southern Bluefin Tuna

The Commonwealth has contracted the University of Tasmania to undertake a survey of recreational fisher effort, catch, release and harvest estimates of Southern Bluefin Tuna (SBT) and other large tuna and billfish. The survey will be undertaken in South Australia (SA), Victoria (VIC), Tasmania (TAS) and New South Wales (NSW) using varied techniques appropriate to each state as described below.

The survey methodology is based on the 2015 report 'Developing robust and cost-effective methods for estimating the national recreational catch of Southern Bluefin Tuna in Australia' (Moore et al., 2015). Data collection will begin on 1 December 2018 and conclude on 30 November 2019. The survey results are expected to be available by mid-2020.

Western Australia is not being surveyed by the University of Tasmania because the data on SBT catch in Western Australia is collected bi-annually by the Western Australian Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development. The Western Australian data will be included in the analysis and final report of the national SBT recreational fishing survey. SBT are not found off the Queensland or Northern Territory coasts.

A probability-based intercept survey (creel), conducted at key access points in SA, will be applied to assess the catch, effort and release rates of SBT and other tuna and billfish caught by the recreational sector in the state. Given the large number of access points in SA, the methodology applied will be based on that conducted by Moore et. al. (2015), but with a higher number of sampling days as recommended by Moore et. al. (2015) to improve confidence intervals around harvest and effort estimates.

The state will be stratified into regions, with random sampling of access points conducted in each regional stratum. The access points (boat ramps) targeted will be based on those reported by Moore et. al. (2015) and confirmed by a series of experts, to ensure any shifts in the dynamic of boat ramp use since the last survey was conducted are incorporated.

Further stratification for day type will also be implemented, with weekdays sampled at a lower sampling fraction than weekend/public holidays. A seasonal stratification will also be applied, with the maximum sampling fractions applied during peak seasons and a reduced sampling fraction applied in seasons where there is a reduced probability of fishers encountering SBT. Sampling events will occur for daytime fishing only.

The actual sampling fractions for each region and access point will be determined after confirmation by expert interviews on the ramps currently most commonly used by game fishers. Based on the recommendations arising from Moore et. al. (2015), a total of 550 sample days is expected, which includes sampling at Port MacDonnell.

Port MacDonnell will be treated separately, as it is the most commonly used access point to target SBT for the recreational sector in SA. An access point survey will be conducted at this location, replicating the methods proposed for the onsite surveys in VIC, using 'day' as the PSU and a similar sampling fraction to that proposed for the Portland boat ramp in VIC.

National Recreational Fishing Survey of Southern Bluefin Tuna

The creel surveys will begin on 1 December 2018 and conclude on 30 November 2019. The contact details of access-point interview respondents will be collected, to generate a frame from which a sample can be derived to perform the wash-up survey, administered as part of the offsite survey in the other target states.

On each sampling day, a member of each vessel retrieved at the boat ramp will be interviewed and asked a series of questions related to the fishing activity that occurred from the vessel on the day. Questions will include core information relating to the capture of SBT and other game fish species including other large tuna and billfish, such as fishing location, effort (fishing time), number of fishers and number of target species caught (kept and released). SBT will be measured based on a random selection process throughout the onsite survey.

If the number of vessels returning to the boat ramp at a given time exceeds the capacity of the creel clerks to interview all vessels, the clerks will randomly interview as many as possible, and record the number of vessels missed.

Charter boat sector


Catch and effort from the charter boat sector will be collated from the mandatory charter boat logbook program which operates in SA.


