

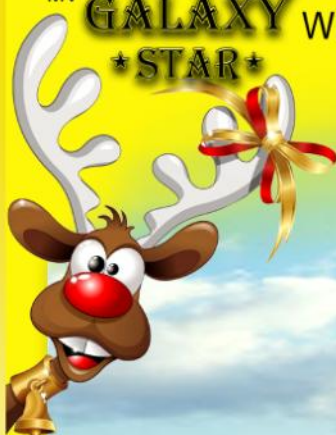

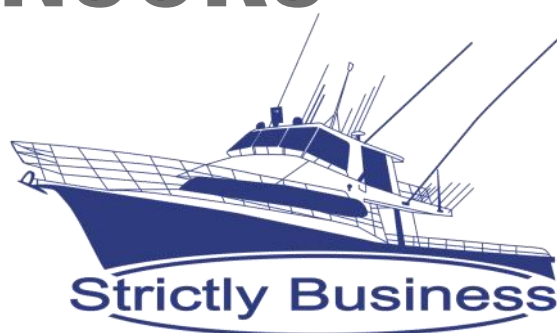
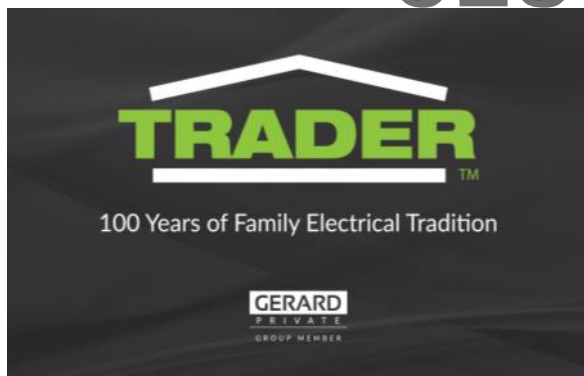

Financial Overview of Club



Good morning members from Kangaroo Island, where it is cool and cloudy with a light breeze blowing. Each day I take my dog down to the boat ramp for her to have a run around and I can talk to the fishers coming back in.

Fishing generally has been steady with most getting their whiting quota fishing outside the "spit" and the weather has been kind with few rough days and winter storms. That said, one of our ferries is in dry dock with a broken propeller so we're down to one ferry – looks like being out of action for at least a couple of weeks as Sealink rang me to reschedule my next Adelaide trip in a week's time. Just when the tourist numbers are soaring – they can't go overseas or Victoria, so we're getting the benefit of that, but it's stretching the Island's accommodation facilities. If you're planning a trip over for the holiday season, book the ferry and your accommodation now. Hopefully no more ferry problems – Sealink has been requesting that the Government invest in expanding the facilities particularly at Cape Jervis to allow for bigger ferries, but given the rocky ground, a new facility at Wirrina might be a better option. The Mayor over here has been negotiating for some time to get the Glenelg-Kingscote run restored, but nothing yet – this place isn't called Kanga-rumour Island for nothing.

CRITERIA OF THE NEW NONE LINE CLASS FISHING SECTION & HOW IT ALL WORKS

Some of our more active anglers are aware of this new section but not all of the membership. So I'm laying it all out so everyone can be more involved or at least be more aware of how you can participate.

This season is the first full season the club is running this new fishing section in the hope of attracting some new members into the club, so these new members as well as our established & active members can compete in this section which will be known as the... "NONE LINE CLASS SECTION".

This section is geared toward making a competition within the club that is easier to understand, with less paper work or without any excessive rules to follow, as well as being able to claim something for those times when fish are caught fishing line classes that don't make the line class used & for the new members that don't wish to fish line classes at all. The categories in this "NONE LINE CLASS SECTION" have been made as simple as possible.

1. Only GFAA game species will be accepted.
2. The fish must be caught legally as by the state fisheries rules, regulation & legal sizes & or by GFAA sizes which ever is applicable for that species.
3. All species entered in this section whether claimed as a Capture or Tag Capture, MUST BE WEIGHED.
(if claimed as a tag capture the tag itself will not be counted in the tag count for the year.)
4. Tags used in the none line section will only count as a single tag across all categories & divisions with no points attached, the angler with the most tags by the end of the season will be the winner of this tag category.
5. The heaviest of each Game Species entered in each category and division at the end of the year, will be the winner of that species.
6. Recording forms will still need to be filled out, no point scoring required but all other info on the form is still required to be filled out and the form will still need to be sent in within the normal time period allowed, to be counted.

NOTE:-

There will be no more none line class 50 points scoring in the line class categories as in the past, from now on these none line class tags will be counted in the new none "NONE LINE CLASS TAGGING SECTION" as laid out in item 4 above.

Category = (Game Boats ,Trailer Boats & Land Base)
 Division = (Men's, Ladies, juniors, Small Fry & NONE Line Class)
 Section = (Highest Points, Tagging, Capture, Heaviest, Most Meritorious etc)
 Species = (Listed GFAA Game Fish, Sharks & Eagle Rays combined)
 Game Fish = (Listed GFAA fish only)
 NONE Line Class = (Anglers that are fishing under state law & not GFAA Line Classes & Equipment Rules

TECHNICAL ADVISOR KNOT TIP



GFCSA Technical Advisor

Here is the step by step **F.G. Knot** process for joining Mono to Braid, for those who wish to run mainly Braid backing on their reels with the required attach GFAA rule of at least the first 5 meters of line class mono being the recognized used line class.

(although I personally would recommend attaching at least 20 meters) this will have your gear compatible with & if you are ever going to apply for a future potential record claim, you may be lucky enough to catch when you are fishing.

This method of joining Braid to Mono rule can be referenced on the GFAA Web Site under the headings "Rules and Equipment Regulations" then select "Line, Backing, Double, Leaders" see under Sub section (a)

 - 2 Wrap it around the other side
 - 3 Repeat steps 1 and 2 23 times
 - 4 Pull both ends to tighten

 - 6 Repeat step 5 9 times
 - 7 Pull the ends to tighten and cut off the blue tag end
 - 8 Make 2 red loops around the red standing part
 - 9 Pull the ends to tighten and cut off excess red tag end
 - 10 The knot is complete

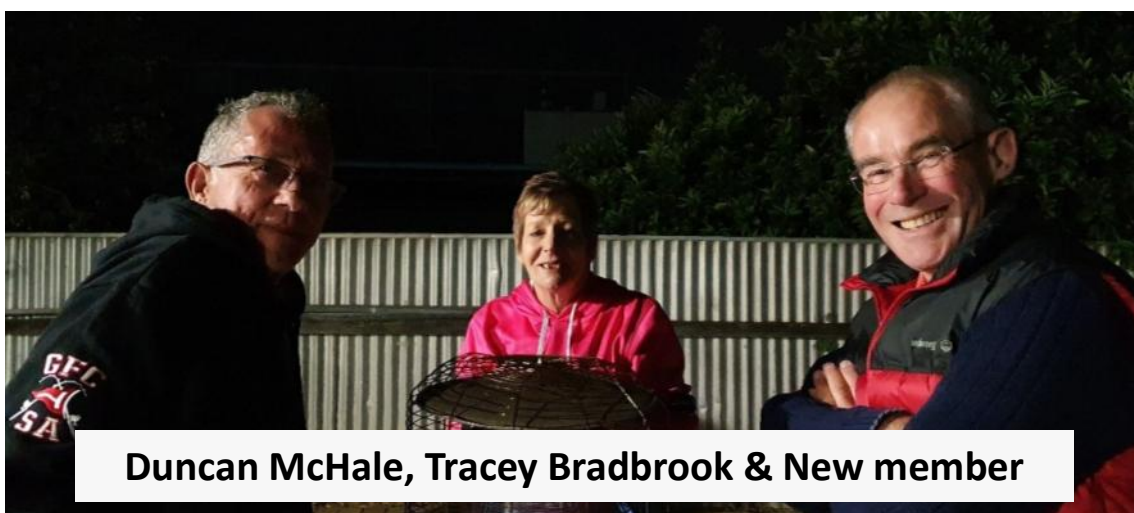

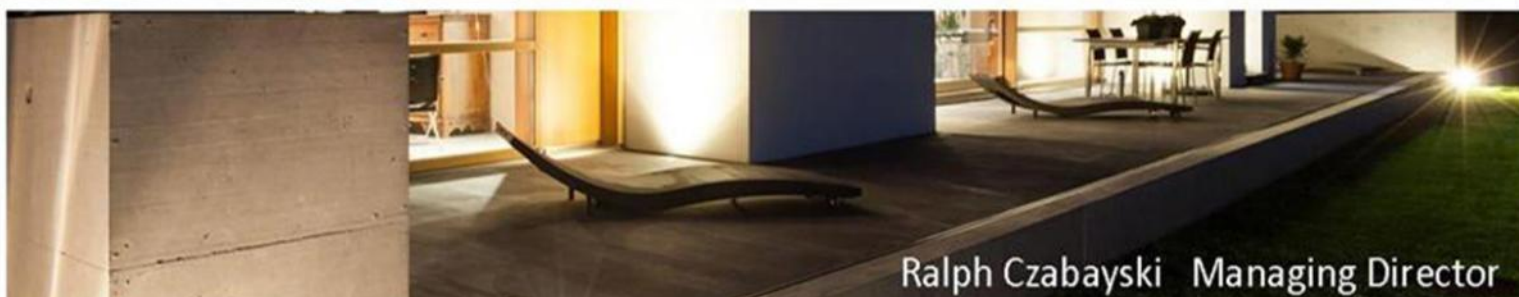

WORLD RECORD HUNT

by Ralph the President

A month or so I got a call from my son Ralph asking me if I would like to join him on a trip to Cairns and Cooktown to Join the 50ft Game Boat Katana skippered by Shark's Miles. The reason for the Charter is after Ralph caught a 1112lb Black Marlin with Miles a couple years ago, he got the appetite to hunt for a Black Marlin World Record on 24kg Line, as his daughter Alexandra (my granddaughter) has a Junior Black Marlin World Record from a few years ago, which is still standing on Ralphs Game Boat, a 55ft Viking he had at Port Douglas at the time. The existing Black Marlin record on 24kg line is at present 509.84kg and been there since the 31 October 1969 caught by an angler by the Name of Ed Seay in Queensland.

This is about to change in the next few years; Hopefully Ralph can get his name on this prestige's Record. Many anglers obviously try and end up giving or are still at it. First you have to find a good skipper and boat with experience with the behavior of the Marlin and where to find them. This is not all, you have to be lucky to find this big fish, stay connected and get it into gaffing range in the shortest possible time, with a lot quick and fast backing up to chase this massive Marlin on such a light line and hope he is not shadowed by a big Tiger shark or a pack of whaler sharks, as only one bite is taken out by the sharks the fish is automatically disqualified for any record application.

I agreed to join Ralph on this expedition for the 8 days to the Barrier Reef north of Cairns and made sure he had all requirements packed. Electronic scale, just in case there is none available on location, all his rods and 80W Shimano reels fully loaded with the right line and fully loaded spools of 24kg line as spare, with the possibility of getting spooled or damaged line. We left Adelaide for Cairns with Jet star. On arrival we took a taxi to get to Hinterland Air Charter to fly on to Cooktown, further up North where we met our Charter Boat and made this our home for the next 7 days. At night time, we anchoring behind the Ripen reef. Katana is a very nice, 12 month old 50ft Game Boat. It has been handcrafted, the brand is "Assagai".

As we arrived at Cooktown with our private organized flight, the pilot ordered a Taxi to take us to our boat. As we arrived, everything got loaded into Katana and we were on the way, as there is still time to go to number 5 Ripen Reef and try to wet a line. The Weather forecast for the next 7 days was perfect. We arrived at the reef and soon the skip bait was deployed. A 5kg Tuna was towed on the Star board Rigger with a scad swimming bait on the Port Site, we had been trolling to about 17-45hr but had no inquiry and it was time for a second beer for Ralph and a nice cool Bacardi for myself before the anchor went down behind the Reef number 5 .

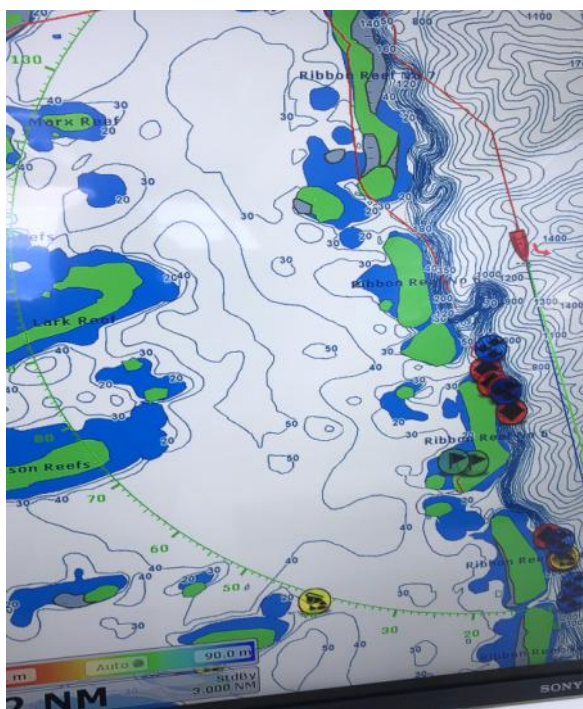

Next morning at about 9:30am, we left the anchorage to troll for some fresh Marlin Baits, Scalies & Scads. After we had our bait at about 11:30am, we started trolling. The water was clear and a beautiful blue colour, not long after we started trolling the Starboard rigger clip made a loud noise and the 80W reel started to scream! Ralph quickly took the rod out of the gunnel and hopped into the Game Chair. After 10 minutes, the marlin was in tagging range. Only a Rat about 300lb and was quickly tagged and released. This was all for the day before retiring behind the reef for the night. The next couple of days Ralph tagged and released another 2 Marlin, but no big Mama in sight.

I knew one of our Club Members and good friend Bob Hill was at Lizard Island with Family with his new 67ft Merrit Game Boat "Maytai" and his Mother Ship Huntress on the way north. So I made a quick call and we got an invite for Dinner the next day for Ralph and myself on Huntress. Because of Covid 19, we have not catch up for a long time with Bob, but we had a lot to talk about. Thank you Bob and Cherokee for the nice night we had. As we were transferred back, late at night by Huntress Skipper Steve, we saw a lot of Tiger Sharks and Whalers, you would not like to fall in. When I was there in the 90's with my Boat Calypso 2, we hardly ever saw any sharks at the anchorage at Lizard Island. The Sharks were out of control, you would not volunteer for a quick dib. We boarded Kantana, our home and had a few more drinks and retired from the long day.

The next day fishing was good with a lot of action in the area. A number of 700 & 800lb Black Marlin had been caught and released, our first strike came at 3:30pm when one big Marlin took the bait but didn't get hooked up. Straight after, we had another hook up and Ralph had it in tagging range for the deckhand to place a tag and release it. The next day, Ralph tagged a Black Marlin, a Blue Marlin and hooked up on a Sailfish but the Sail was a bit small to hook up on a 20/0 Hook. If Ralph would have got this Sailfish he would have had a **GRAND SLAM** - 3 Billfish in a Day. So the trip came to the end and we were on our way back to Cooktown about 30 miles from the Reef Number 5. The next day we were driving a car, another team arrived to go out on charter for the next 8 days back to Cairns. Ralph didn't get his record on this trip but had a wonderful time and will be back next season. This trip Ralph Tagged 7 Marlin in total.

CORAL SEA FISHING TRIP

Bob Hill

Upon leaving Cato Reef we headed further east towards Wreck Reefs 65nm. A Historic area of reef where Mathew Flinders, a passenger on the sailing ship Porpoise accompanied by the other ship Cato struck the reef together. All survivors ended up on the Sandcay for two months & made a 35ft boat out of the wreckage & Mathew Flinders sailed it back to Sydney with 18 men to get help for the others. Tough life in the early 1800.



We fished with lures on the Southern side of wreck reef as the weather turned sour. 25 kts from the South east & managed to hook a blue marlin which nailed the Hawaiian lure on the left. The marlin gave quite a few good jumps before we were able to have it close to the boat, where it threw the hook (fortunately) as it was way too green .

We then travelled further east to Kenn reefs which has two sand cays on various parts of the reef both have evidence of shipwrecks. In fact, I had visited Kenn reef some 18 years earlier & on the main cay a Japanese Longliner ended its days in a spectacular manner.



It had snapped in two with the bow pointing to the moon & the mid section & refrigeration area had masses of swordfish frames which I removed one frame about 1500 long. Outside on the sand cay were about 20 empty bottles of Japanese whisky & Sake. Now most of the ship has rusted away.

We speared some good sized trout in the cracks of the coral, but not as big as the previous trip where I managed to spear a 55lb trout. Probably full of Siga, the poison to all who dare to eat. We trolled around the reef and caught wahoo & medium size yellow fin. However, disappointed that we didn't hook a Marlin .

We didn't see another boat for a week & headed back towards Mulgrave Island where we caught some Spanish & Mac tuna on a nearby shoal. Then it was time to head back to South Port & the weather was still blowing 25kts. We had been dodging whales consistently as they stick close to the coast to avoid the south current but their population is increasing every year.

As we proceeded south with water all over the boat at 23kts, we suddenly felt a huge bang & I thought we had hit a container but upon inspection, shells from the whale fin were in abundance & all shells had live animals inside. John Leftwich, my footy mate suggested we eat them as they must taste great coming from the Antarctic off a whale.

Miracles happen we had superficial damage to the leg of the tower 2m above the waterline. We kept going without prop damage, my mate Bill McLeod lost a bet on that. Counting & spotting 100 whales for the trip. They are in plague proportions here. I know of a guy who hit one in his 30ft whaler at 30 knots. It sent him skywards for 50m didn't hurt the whale but only his arm when landing.

We finally returned to Southport after a great adventure.

TIPS & TECHNIQUES




If you take a look at your crankbaits, lippled plugs, topwater lures or spoons, odds are they will have at least one or two treble hooks hanging freely from the body of the lure. Although the treble hooks are able to catch the fish you're after, taking the hooks out of a fish can often be dangerous for the angler and harmful to the fish. If you catch the fish, try to replace most of your treble hooks with single hooks. The single hooks will make it easier to remove the hook, allowing for a faster release of the fish.

Swapping treble hooks out for single hooks or IGFA compliant assist hooks has several advantages. If you've fished long enough with treble hook lures, you've likely found your hand, arms or clothing on the business end of the hook. A lure that utilizes one or two single hooks is going to be much easier to remove from the mouth of a fish and will enable you to quickly and safely handle the fish. Another benefit of a swapping out your treble hooks for single hooks is that single hook lures will snag less vegetation and debris than their treble counterparts. The fish that is hooked by a single hook is much more enjoyable to handle than the fish that is hooked by two treble hooks. A single hook can be hooked in two places by each of the two treble hooks on a lure.

Replacing the treble hooks with single hooks can easily be accomplished using a pair of split ring pliers. The split ring pliers will open the split rings enough so that the eye of the treble hook can be removed. The single hooks can be added by performing the same steps to open the split ring and then slide the eye of the single hook through the ring until it swings free. If a pair of split ring pliers is not available, the treble hooks can also be cut off with a pair of wire cutters.

When the treble hooks are removed, you may have to bump up a size in the single hooks to retain the same weight and drag which the lure is designed to swim. If using a pair of single hooks, make sure to check to ensure that the front hook cannot catch and entangle the back hook. Many anglers have also found success by removing the two treble hooks and adding only a back single hook. Some anglers will modify their treble hooks by simply crushing the barbs of each hook with a pair of pliers so they are easier to remove and some anglers may even just remove two of the three hooks from the treble hook by cutting the points off with a pair of wire cutters.

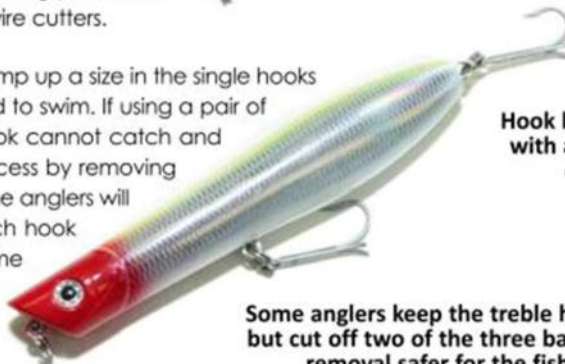
